PREFACE

PLVR is pleased to present Marianna Kennedy's exhibition Supersonic Mediaeval at Christie's France, 9 Avenue Matignon, Galleries from May 5 – 11, 2025.

The exhibition is curated by the actor Tilda Swinton, a long-term admirer and collector of the work of Marianna Kennedy which she memorably termed 'supersonic mediaeval', a phrase equally descriptive of Marianna's character as of her work - distinctly contemporary yet firmly rooted in the past, the backdrop of 18th century Spitalfields and the reinterpretation of traditional skills and techniques.

The exhibition is both a small retrospective and a personal homage by Tilda who as curator draws on her particular viewpoint and understanding to assemble a selection of artefacts from Marianna's studio and home, ranging from a console dated 2024 to her most recent works. This form of creative curatorship enables a fresh view of an artist's oeuvre, as for instance in Wes Anderson's 'Spitzmaus Mummy in a Coffin and other Treasures' at the Kunsthistorische Museum in Vienna in 2018 or the artist Vaclav Pozarek's upcoming retrospective of Diego Giacometti at the Bündner Kunstmuseum in Chur, Switzerland.

For the main room at Christie's Avenue Matignon, Tilda has conceived three stage sets, a choreographed mise-en-scène of Marianna's Spitalfields world. Behind this lies another smaller space - a 'fundus' or props room – where a collection of the artist's work awaits use by the requisiteur for the next set design.

This is a world in which craft and artistic expression combine to enrich the soul; as in the work of Eileen Gray, Jean Dunand or Armand-Albert Rateau, the singular vision of the artist executed by sophisticated artisans employing traditional techniques. "Tilda and I share a respect for craftsmanship and love of beauty bridging the gap between past and present but always looking forward. For us the past is always new."

We would like to thank Tilda Swinton for agreeing to curate this special exhibition, an artist we all admire for her unique style, empathy and humanity.

We would also like to thank the Christie's Design Department, especially Sonja Ganne, Chairwoman Design, for the opportunity to be part of the Christie's Carte Blanche exhibition series; Cécile Verdier, President of Christie's France, who encouraged the conception of Supersonic Mediaeval with great insight and support; and Philippe Lemoine, Chief Operating Officer of Christie's France for overseeing all critical details.
