Introduction

The Studio in a School Association is pleased to present Young Visions 2021, an annual exhibition celebrating the extraordinary artistic achievements of students participating in our visual art programs. Studio engages children and teens from pre-school through twelfth grade at New York City public schools and communitybased organizations in all five boroughs. Working with Studio Artist Instructors, who teach them to look with artists' eyes, our students observe, imagine, and interpret the people, places and things that make up their lives.

Young Visions 2021 takes the form of a digital catalogue. Through these works of art, we see the development of skills and capacities and the artistic choices the students made, whether they worked individually or collaboratively. Beyond the artworks on view, this exhibition honors the effort, learning, growth and creativity of every child who participated in Studio's programs this year.

The 2021 school year was like no other. As our school partners transitioned from in-person to remote learning models, Studio was right there beside them, adapting, innovating, and reimagining how we teach art. Studio Artist Instructors prepared video-recorded lessons and step-by-step handouts for children to explore independently; they beamed into students' homes and classrooms for live-streamed lessons; and when circumstances allowed, they taught in person.

The images collected here reflect how our programs adapted to meet the needs of our students; they highlight innovation and celebrate silver linings. For example, our students could not always access the high-quality art materials we prepare for them. Despite this seeming limitation, the creativity and resourcefulness of our young artists shined through as they repurposed household items to make unconventional works of art and transformed their living spaces into thriving studios. Thanks to the many parents, caretakers, and classroom teachers who generously provided us with images, we see more than just the artworks; we see the proud faces of children holding up their art, children sharing their artworks over Zoom, and glimpses of children engrossed in the creative process.

We are immensely grateful to our Studio Artist Instructors for their hard work and dedication during a singularly challenging year, and we are very proud of all that our students achieved. We hope this exhibition will bring joy to everyone who sees it.

It was founded by Agnes Gund in 1977 in response to budget cuts that virtually eliminated arts education in New York City public schools. Over 44 years, it has served over one million children throughout the five boroughs. Through its New York City Schools Program, Studio offers art instruction to students ranging from pre-K through high school in public schools and community-based organizations citywide. In addition, through the Studio Institute, it engages in research, professional development, and the national dissemination of Studio's programs, while also providing apprenticeships, internships, and skills-based programs for teens and college students.

Lesson Insights

Since the onset of the pandemic, Studio in a School Association has been committed to adapting the format of our lessons to meet the needs of our students and school partners. You will notice the following labels will appear with the information about each piece. These indicate the type of learning model the students experienced when creating their artworks.

■ Asynchronous Learning

With asynchronous learning, teaching and learning do not happen at the same time. The Studio Artist Instructor shares written and/or pre-recorded video lessons and students engage with them during school hours, in the classroom with their classroom teacher, at home with their caregiver, or on their own.

■ Synchronous Learning

Synchronous learning occurs in real time via remote learning platforms, such as Google Meet or Zoom.

■ In-Person Learning

When circumstances allowed, and the safety and wellbeing of our staff was assured, Studio was thrilled for Artist Instructors to teach in person.

Studio Celebrates Burberry Inspire

Studio in a School's New York City Schools Program (Studio NYC) is pleased to be a cultural partner of Burberry Inspire New York which aims to provide young people in middle school with deep and varied experiences in the arts. The Burberry Foundation started Burberry Inspire in 2018 in Yorkshire, UK, and expanded the program internationally in New York City in 2020.

Last year, Studio NYC partnered with M.S. 582 in Brooklyn and the Bronx Writing Academy. Students worked with artists in several media, including drawing and painting, and explored line, contour, color, tone, and value. For twelve weeks, they worked from both observation and imagination, focusing on inspired journeys, connecting to imaginary landscapes and expressive self-portraits. In 2021, Studio NYC has been partnering with Kappa III in the Bronx and M.S. 358 in Queens with live-streamed synchronous programs, engaging students with art making, virtual museum visits, and discussion.

Works of art from the Burberry Inspire program appear throughout this catalogue, however we have gathered them again to further celebrate the impact of this extraordinary program.


